Important Humanitarian Information

The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) reported an increase in protection risks in Lebanon due to the escalation of hostilities, which is impacting safety, shelter, and mental health. (2)(1)



Thousands, including displaced refugees and Lebanese citizens, are being forced to sleep in open areas or face the risk of eviction, especially in conflict areas.

Vulnerable groups, such as women, children, and people with disabilities, are experiencing a rise in psychological problems due to a lack of shelter and limited services. These risks are exacerbated by movement restrictions and administrative obstacles, which further increase the fragility of their situations.

The latest report from the health sector highlighted the severe impact of ongoing hostilities on healthcare workers, facilities, and services in Lebanon. (1)



Approximately 100 primary healthcare centers and clinics, as well as eight hospitals, have been closed.

Insecurity and access difficulties in areas such as the Bekaa Valley and Baalbek are hindering efforts to prepare for and respond to the cholera outbreak. Additionally, insufficient resources and conflicting priorities among health sector partners are preventing the sustainability and expansion of emergency services.

Candice Ardil, Deputy Spokesperson for the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL), confirmed that their forces have been targeted 40 times by the Israeli army, 8 of which were documented on video, noting that some of the attacks were intentional.



The current war has particularly worsened the suffering of residents, especially in Palestinian gatherings that are not classified as refugee camps by UNRWA, which denies them access to the agency's comprehensive services available in official camps such as Rashidiyeh, al-Bass, and al-Burj al-Shamali.
