Key Humanitarian Information This Week: (3)



Only 38% of health service points are operational, with just one functioning point in North Gaza.

- This includes 17 partially functioning hospitals out of 36, 7 field hospitals partially operating out of 15, 61 partially functioning primary health care centers out of 160, and 127 mobile clinics or medical points out of 353.



A total of 477 patients have died while waiting for medical evacuation abroad, and at least 41% of kidney patients have passed away since October 2023 due to restricted access to dialysis services.



Severe overcrowding in Gaza City has forced many families to flee westward toward the port area or sleep on sidewalks, streets, or any other accessible open space.

- These families lack access to water, sanitation, and hygiene services.

- Some have sought shelter in abandoned or damaged buildings, remaining government facilities, or unfinished constructions, often clearing rubble to create temporary living spaces, including rooftops that may be structurally unsafe.

- 40% of displaced individuals fled without taking any belongings due to the urgency of evacuation, financial hardship, and lack of transportation.

Key Risks Threatening the Sector:

By April 2024, 70% of Gaza's fishing assets and infrastructure — including its only port — had been damaged.

Most of the remaining boats and equipment at the Rafah fish landing site were destroyed in January 2025, after Israeli forces bulldozed the area during the week prior to the temporary ceasefire.

These events resulted in the loss of 4,600 tons of annual fish production and the complete shutdown of fish farms, which had previously produced 600 tons annually.

Around 5,000 cancer patients are in urgent need of medical referrals abroad for diagnosis or access to specialized treatment, such as chemotherapy and radiotherapy — especially after the last operational cancer treatment facility at the European Gaza Hospital shut down.

64% of essential cancer medications are out of stock, and equipment shortages are severely limiting diagnostic capabilities.

12 out of 19 CT scanners and 7 MRI machines have been destroyed.

The ongoing crisis in Gaza continues to drive mass displacement amid worsening conditions, with an estimated 1.1 million people in urgent need of emergency shelter assistance.

Tents have been out of stock since April 12, and other essential shelter supplies are also nearing depletion.

This follows 11 consecutive weeks of a near-total blockade on aid entry, along with a continued ban on shelter materials.

- 3 Field hospitals
- 4 Supplies for safe childbirth in hospitals
- 5 Postpartum kits



Shelter Sector

- 1 Mattresses and blankets
- 2 Tents for IDPs
- 3 Cash intervention



Relief Sector

- 1 Food parcels, fresh bread and canned foods
- 2 Drinking water
- 3 Cooking gas
- 4 Clothing
- 5 Fuel for municipalities to operate water pumping stations
- 6 Cash intervention (Gaza and West Bank)
