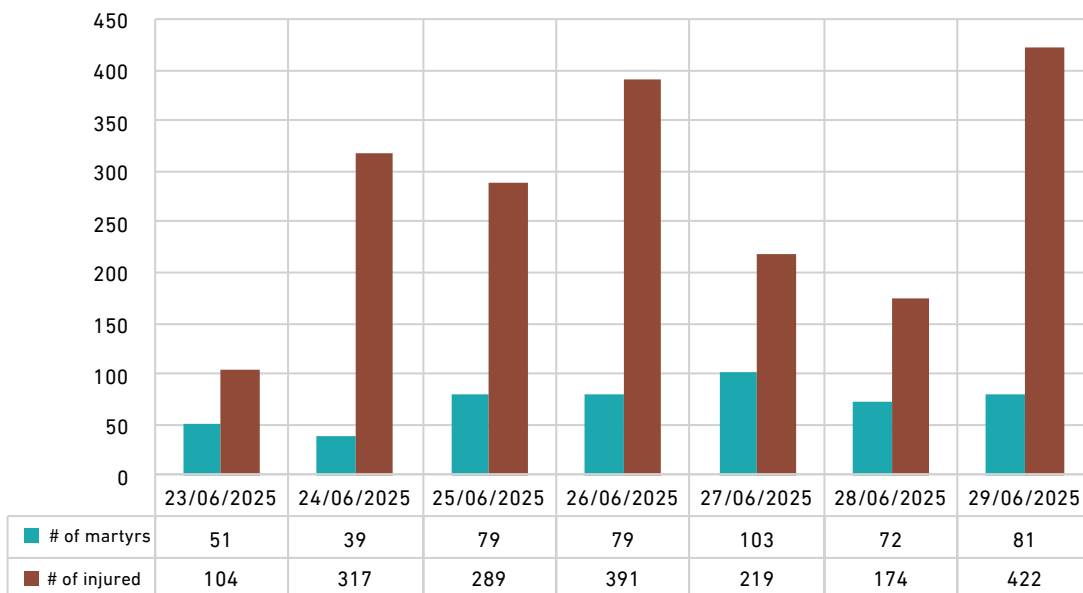

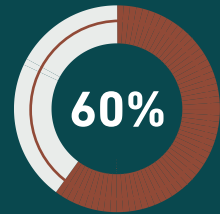

3,700 kilometers of electrical networks destroyed by the occupation

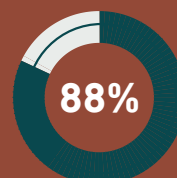

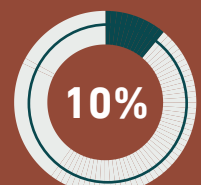

Key Humanitarian Information This Week: (3)

Health Crisis at Al-Aqsa Martyrs Hospital – Gaza:

- Over 580 people have been killed and 4,000 injured while waiting for aid, amid the near-total collapse of the healthcare system.
- Widespread disease outbreaks, particularly among children, are reported across Gaza. Malnutrition is prevalent in all governorates, and more than 400 cases of meningitis have been recorded since the start of the year.



Critical Shortages in Laboratory Supplies:

- 48.7% of laboratory test materials and 48.2% of consumables are at less than one month's stock.
- These severe shortages directly threaten the continuity of diagnostic and blood transfusion services.
- The situation has worsened with the destruction of 50% of hospital laboratories and 60% of primary healthcare labs, resulting in 514 lab devices going out of service.



Water Crisis Threatens Lives Across Gaza:

- Palestinian families across Gaza face life-threatening dehydration as water systems collapse. Only 40% of water production facilities remain functional.
- UNRWA reported its capacity to deliver water has dropped by half compared to the ceasefire period, due to ongoing Israeli bombardment, forced displacement orders, and Israel's fuel blockade for over 100 days.
- Per capita water access in Gaza has declined by 99% due to the systematic destruction of water infrastructure.
- Since October 7, 2023, Israeli forces have destroyed 719 water wells, rendering them inoperable and triggering a severe water crisis.



Key Risks Threatening the Sector:

Shelter Crisis:

- 1.1 million people are in urgent need of emergency shelter, with living conditions rapidly deteriorating.
- Temporary shelters are now concentrated in destroyed schools, public lands, and the rubble of urban areas—often far exceeding their capacity and lacking basic infrastructure.
- Fuel shortages and the collapse of water and sanitation services have turned many shelters into hotspots for public health hazards.



Severe Food Insecurity:

- The World Food Programme (WFP) and its food security partners collected qualitative data to assess household consumption and coping strategies in Gaza.
- Most families report surviving on a single, meager daily meal consisting of thin soup, lentils or rice with salt, pasta, canned beans or peas, or boiled legumes.
- One-third of households go entire days without food or survive on just a piece of bread with za'atar (dried herb mix). Many drink water to suppress hunger—a common coping mechanism.
- Around 15% of the population resort to scavenging for food in garbage or rubble. Countless individuals risk their lives to access aid at distribution points.



Collapse of WASH Infrastructure:

- 77% of water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) facilities are located within Israeli-declared military zones or areas under evacuation orders since March 18.
- Persistent fuel shortages have forced many water wells to shut down, and desalination plants operate at minimal capacity.

Healthcare Sector

- 1 Fuel for hospitals
- 2 Medicines and medical supplies
- 3 Field hospitals
- 4 Supplies for safe childbirth in hospitals
- 5 Postpartum kits



Shelter Sector

- 1 Mattresses and blankets
- 2 Tents for IDPs
- 3 Cash intervention



Relief Sector

- 1 Food parcels, fresh bread and canned foods
- 2 Drinking water
- 3 Cooking gas
- 4 Clothing
- 5 Fuel for municipalities to operate water pumping stations
- 6 Cash intervention (Gaza and West Bank)
